

**Paradise Town Council Meeting**  
**June 29, 2012**  
**6:00 p.m.**

**Council Members Present:** Mayor Leland Howlett, Dale Anderson, Kyle Smith, Jay Rinderknecht and Margaret Obray

Bev is excused from this meeting. Mayor Howlett took the minutes of this meeting.

**Bills**

Margaret read the bills of June 29, 2012. A motion was made by Jay to accept the bills as read. Seconded by Margaret. All in favor.

**Consider Property Restrictions**

The current state law was discussed regarding the process of restricting the use of fireworks statewide, in the unincorporated areas, and within municipalities. The county fire officials have determined that no fireworks may be used east of 100 East or west of 300 West in Paradise. Based on the State statute, a complete ban by a municipality is not permissible and no consensus was reached regarding safe or not safe areas based on the various blocks and neighborhoods. The council recommended no further restrictions of firework use.

**Weaver Property Restricted Status**

The Weaver property at approximately 8950 South and 100 West was discussed at the meeting of June 20<sup>th</sup> and the Council recommended that the status be changed from restricted to grandfathered. Mat Weaver was told to go pursue getting a recordable document prepared for Planning and Zoning and the Council to sign to permanently document that status change. The document regarding status change and the reasons for it was approved by Planning and Zoning at their meeting on June 28, 2012. Margaret made a motion for the Mayor to sign the document, seconded by Dale. All in favor.

**Council Reports**

- **Roads** – Jay received input from LTAP regarding the intersection at 9200 South and 200 West. LTAP believed that by installing a 4-way stop sign at that intersection that the intersection was safe if traffic laws were followed. To prevent jumping attempts by cars, additional fill could be added to the road at a cost of about \$14,000, including repaving. Jay agreed to get a recommendation from LTAP in writing. The Mayor will contact the Sheriff Office again to ask for increased patrols in that area. The Mayor will also look into adding a Limited Sight Distance sign and a flashing stop sign.

- **Water-** The Mayor gave a report on preparations to repair a water leak at 400 East and 9000 South. An update was also provided on the water tank construction project.
- **Community** – Erin Foster agreed to help the Youth Council with a display at the County Fair this August.
- **Grants/Fire/Budget** – The Fire Department may have to find an alternative location for the Trap Shoot due to the construction of the water tank at the gravel pit. A representative from the Fire Department will come to the next Council meeting July 18<sup>th</sup> to discuss grants.

A motion was made by Jay to adjourn. Seconded by Margaret. All in favor. Meeting closes at 6:57 pm.
