Bills

Margaret read the bills of September 19, 2012. A motion was made by Jay and seconded by Margaret . All in favor.

Fire Department

Mayor Howlett reported that our brush truck had left for Spokane, Washington with the Cache County Fire Department.

Consider Cell Tower Rental Offer

Mayor Howlett asked the council if they had read over the proposed cell tower contract. There is no incentive for us to accept the new contract. Mayor Howlett will tell the cell tower representative that we are going to stick with the current contract that we have. A motion was made by Margaret to extend our thanks to AT&T for the contract offer, but we will stay with our current contract. Seconded by Dale. All in favor.

Consider liaison for Utah National Guard Community Covenant Program

The National Guard wants us to appoint a liaison for their community covenant program. This person would assist veterans in our community who need assistance, with the different resources that are available. Tim Davis, Grant Obray and Kelly Cronquist were names that were suggested. Mayor Howlett will talk to Kelly Cronquist first and ask him if he would be interested.

Council Reports

- **Roads** – Nothing to report at this time.
- **Water** – Mayor Howlett reported on the status of the new water tank. Currently they are checking for leaks. After they take care of any leaks they will start the back fill process.
- **Community-** Mayor Howlett and Jay Rinderknecht reported on the service project that was held on Saturday, September 15th. There were about 250 volunteers in attendance. Approximately 30 people worked at the new park. They were able to remove the old fence, fence posts and trees. They then put the

new posts in cement and hauled everything away. A group worked on Patricia Tinney's yard and another group painted Rosann Wilson's home. Mayor Howlett will send a thank you card to the Stake. Margaret reported that she had gone to the session at our conference that addressed civil democracy in the community. She was very impressed with what Murray City was doing in their community. It is a program that can be run by someone living in the community. She was impressed with the positive effects that come from this program.

- **Grants/Fire/Budget** – Dale had nothing to report at this time. Mayor Howlett is going to go on the UCLT's website to see what grant's available for parks and trails.

Unfinished Business

- There was a discussion on the need for the town to post agendas and minutes on the town website. It hasn't been updated since Mat Weaver left the council. There were suggestions to either have Mat do the updates or for Mat to teach Bev to do the postings. We also need to send agendas to the Herald Journal.
- Porter Trunnell came to have Mayor Howlett sign his Eagle packet. He reported on what he had done to identify signs in the community that needed replaced.
- Margaret asked if a letter could be sent to Quentin Casperson. Mr. Casperson was making progress and then he started bringing in more materials.
