

**Paradise Town Council Meeting**  
**September 17, 2014**  
**7:30 p.m.**

**Council Members Present:**

**Minutes:**

The Minutes of August 20, 2014 and September 3, 2014 were emailed and read previous to the meeting. Margaret suggested adding further clarification under the Ted Woolf portion of the September 3, 2014 minutes. Spencer suggested further clarification on the amount of money brought in by the Fire Department for the Trout and Berry Day dinner. Spencer made a motion to approve the August 20, 2014 minutes as amended; Jay seconded that motion, all in favor. Margaret made a motion to approve the minutes of September 3, 2014 as amended; Spencer seconded that motion, all in favor.

**Bills:**

Margaret read the bills. Margaret made a motion to approve the bills as read; Jay seconded that motion, all in favor.

**Parking Concerns on 8800 South:** There have been concerns about a trailer sometimes parked on 8800 south. It is parked close to the road or with one of the back tires on the road. A deputy was called and talked to the home owner who did move the trailer. There are now concerns that there are rocks and trees close to the road and a sign that says "slow, children at play" placed close to the road. James Hamilton made a request that the Town draft a written letter to the homeowners to remove the rocks, trees, and sign on the town right-of-way. Mayor Howlett read through the ordinances, and there is not an ordinance that specifies people cannot landscape on the town right-of-way. If the rocks are so close to the road that they are being hit when the snowplow comes through, the rocks may need to be moved back. Mr. and Mrs. Hamilton also suggested the Town adopts an ordinance allowing angled parking at different places around town.

**Sheriff's Department Contract:** The Sheriff's Department sent a 5-year contract to be signed by the Town for law enforcement services. It would take effect in 2014 until 2019. The Council would feel more comfortable with signing a 1-year contract not a 5-year contract. Mayor Howlett will contact the Sheriff's Department and see if they will draft a 1-year contract.

**Animal Control Contract:** The Sheriff's Department sent a 5-year contract to be signed by the Town for Animal Control Services. It would take effect in 2014 until 2019. The Council would feel more comfortable with a 1-year contract. Mayor Howlett will contact the Sheriff's Department about drafting a 1-year Animal Control Contract. The Council would like to meet with someone from Animal Control and work out some specifics on how they will help the Town handle loose dogs, dogs harassing passerby's, excessive barking, etc.

**Council Reports:**

- **Roads-** Nothing to report at this time.
- **Water-** Hansen and Associates sent a packet with all the information for the new canyon well pump. The plan is to get bids and try to get the pump replaced this fall before the weather is too bad to get to the well.
- **Community** – Margaret passed along what she learned about Administrative Law and communication techniques at the ULCT convention. She also learned about other cities that had designated bike routes and how they were able to build these bike routes without spending a great deal of money.
- **Grants/Fire/Budget-** Blake Pulsipher reported that the Fire Department will be doing their extrication drill on Wednesday September 24, 2014. The car they will be using will be delivered on Tuesday the 23<sup>rd</sup> or the morning of the 24<sup>th</sup>.

**Unfinished Business:** Deputy Pierson came to introduce himself as one of the deputies assigned to the Paradise area. He informed the Council that Todd Parker is the new animal control officer.

Spencer brought to the attention of the Council that some of the Town's ordinances are out-of-date or could use additional wording for easier understanding. Margaret requested accessibility to the ordinance book to read through and see what could use some updating. Lee Atwood also offered to look through the zoning ordinances and see what needed updating to bring before the Council and Planning and Zoning.

**New Business:** No new business at this time.

Jay made a motion to adjourn; Margaret seconded that motion, all in favor. Meeting adjourns at 9:55 p.m.
