

**Paradise Town Council Meeting**  
**January 21, 2015**  
**7:00 p.m.**

**Council Members Present:** Mayor Leland Howlett, Margaret O Bray, Jay Rinderknecht, Alyssa Petersen (recorder)

**Excused:** Spencer Winn, Kyle Smith

**Townspeople Present:** James Hamilton

**Minutes:** The minutes of January 7, 2015 were emailed to all the Council members previous to the meeting. Margaret made a motion to approve the minutes, Jay seconded that motion, all in favor.

**Bills:** Margaret read the bills, Jay made a motion to approve the bills as read, Margaret seconded that motion, all in favor.

**Park Committee/Pavilion Plans for New Park:** Park Committee was not able to make it to this meeting. The pavilion plans were not discussed at this time.

**Council Reports:**

- **Roads-** Mayor Howlett replaced some of the old, worn parts on the plow. Mayor Howlett would like to look into the budget and see if there are any roads in town that need paved this year, or if it would be best to hold off for a year and then pave a few roads at one time. He suggested doing some more slurry seal this year and then putting a list together of roads that need paved for next year. It saves the Town money to have a few roads paved at a time, versus just a block at a time.
- **Water-** There were a few more water samples taken this year due to some changes in the Town's water system and state law. The new pump was placed in the canyon well. It's not wired yet and the plan is to have the electrical components in by the end of January 2015.
- **Community-** Nothing to discuss at this time.
- **Grants/Fire/Budget-** Nothing to discuss at this time.

**Unfinished Business:** Nothing to discuss at this time.

**New Business:** Mr. Hamilton attended the meeting to discuss his concerns with the parking on 8800 south. There are numerous vehicles parked along the road there, there are trees there and a post that says "child at play." Mr. Hamilton is concerned that this is a safety hazard and a child could run out from behind a vehicle and get hit, or someone could hit one of the things sitting directly off the side of the road. He is also concerned it could block the visibility at the intersection at 8800 south. Mayor Howlett would like to talk to the canal company and see if some of the big trees can be trimmed back to help with visibility. Mr. Hamilton would like to know what will be done about these problems.

The Council will talk to the Sherriff's Department and see if they can be of any help with this situation. Jay suggested using some of the road funds to help clean up the trees that cause visibility or safety issues around town.

**Adjourn:** Jay made a motion to adjourn; Margaret seconded that motion, all in favor. Meeting adjourns at 7:46 p.m.
