Grilling Safety

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling.

SAFETY TIPS

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

CHARCOAL GRILLS

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

Increased Garbage Collection Rates

Beginning August 1, 2018 you will notice that your monthly bill is approximately \$2.00 higher. Cache County has had to increase garbage collection rates to support increasing costs and you will see that increase reflected on your monthly bill beginning August.

Water Overages

Some of you may notice that your water bill shows an overage and is higher than usual.

All of the water meters in town get read every six months and our spring/summer reads are now done.

If you have an overage, there are a few things you can check before calling the Office:

- Do you have a toilet or water softener that cycles and runs frequently or constantly?
- Have you used your culinary water to water animals, flower beds, lawns, or any other outside watering?
- Do you have a leak you are aware of?

If you think you may have a leak, please call the Office and we can help you get that figured out.

If you do have a leak, we can adjust the amount you were billed for the overage once the leak is fixed.
